If your iPad has been frozen or is not responding, then you can fix this issue by force restarting it. The method is also known as "hard reset", as it manually breaks the power cycle of your device.

Plug the iPod nano into a power source (such as a computer or a wall outlet) and let it charge for an hour or more. It could be that the battery is run down and needs to recharge. If you charged the nano and tried the reset steps, and your nano still doesn't work, you may have a problem that you can't solve on your own.

Slide your finger across the slider and iPad will turn off after a few moments. If the iPad is not responding we can then reset the iPad by holding the sleep/wake button and holding the home key simultaneously for 10 seconds. Power up your iPad and reconnect.
